The Walter J. Zable Story

Walter J. Zable — innovative industrialist, honored civic leader, sports enthusiast and former professional athlete — is president and chairman of the board of Cubic Corporation.

The honoree's many and varied interests all contribute to his identity as a man in the mainstream of this century. Schooled at the College of William and Mary and the University of Florida where he received his master's degree in physics and mathematics, he has carved a distinguished executive career in engineering and science. Prior to forming his own company in 1951, he held positions with Sperry Gyroscope Co., the Federal Telecommunications Laboratories of I.T.T., Flight Research Co., Control Instruments and Newport News Shipyard and Drydock. He has also taught at a special vocational school in Danville, Va.

An excellent athlete, he was an All-American honorable mention in football and later played professionally with the Richmond Arrows and New York Giants. He was Southern Conference low hurdle champion in college. In 1962, Sports Illustrated named him to the Silver Anniversary All-American team and in 1969 he was named to the William and Mary Hall of Fame.

He is widely known for his many professional accomplishments in addition to having contributed to many civic and philanthropic endeavors. He holds directorships on the boards of the San Diego Chamber of Commerce, Junior Achievement, San Diego County Junior Golf Association, Museum of Man, San Diego Symphony, Theatre and Arts Foundation of San Diego, and YMCA.

He is a past director of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, and the California Manufacturers Association. Mr. Zable is a trustee of the college of William and Mary Endowment Foundation and a charter member of the Chancellor's Club, University of California at San Diego. San Diego Magazine named him "Industrialist of the Year, 1971." The National Management Association named him the recipient of the 1972 Gold Knight Award, highest honor that may be given by a regional council.

The San Diego Executive Council for the City of Hope is proud to honor such a distinguished humanitarian.

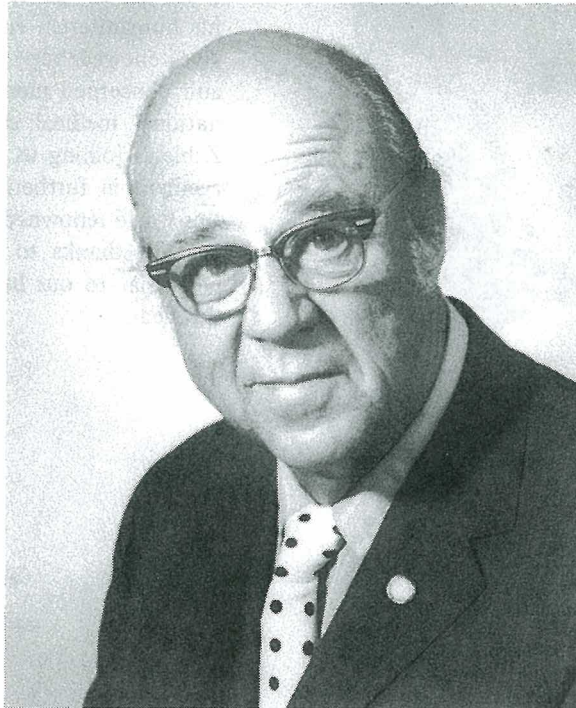

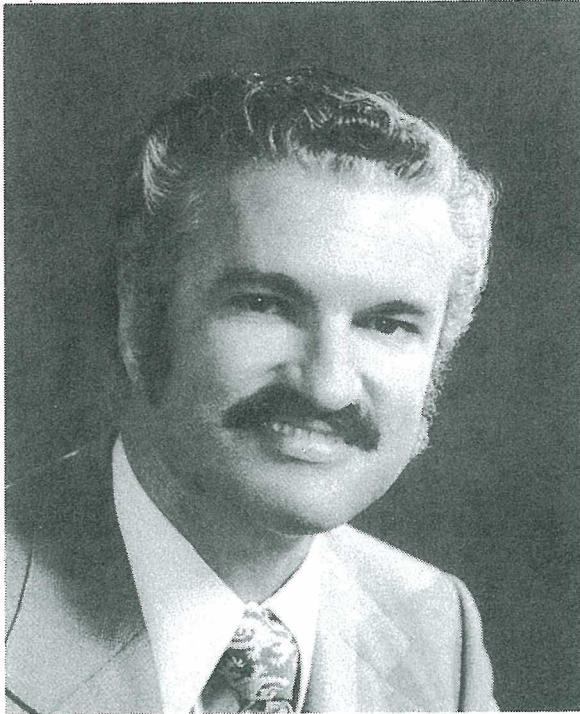


It is with considerable pleasure as well as pride that I personally congratulate my good friend Walter Zable on being named the San Diego Man of the Year.

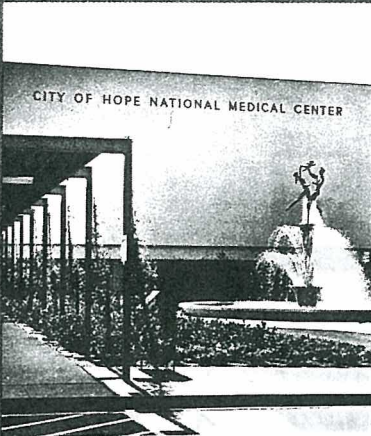

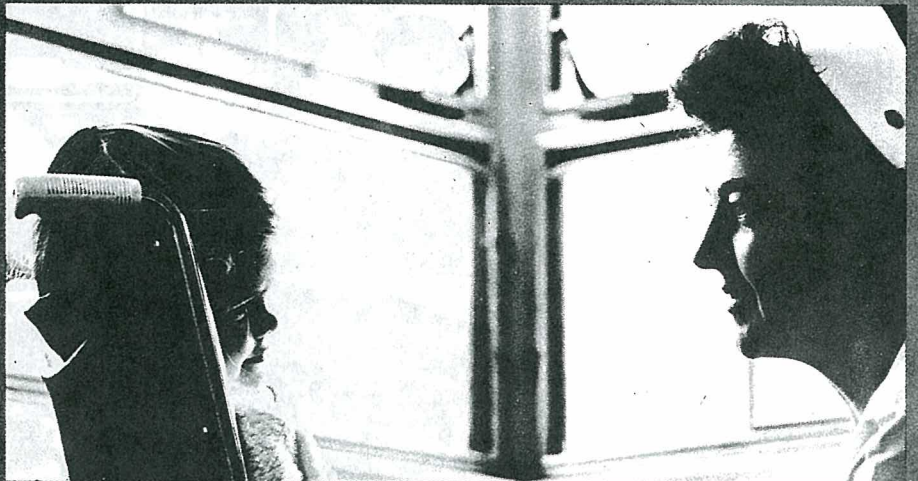
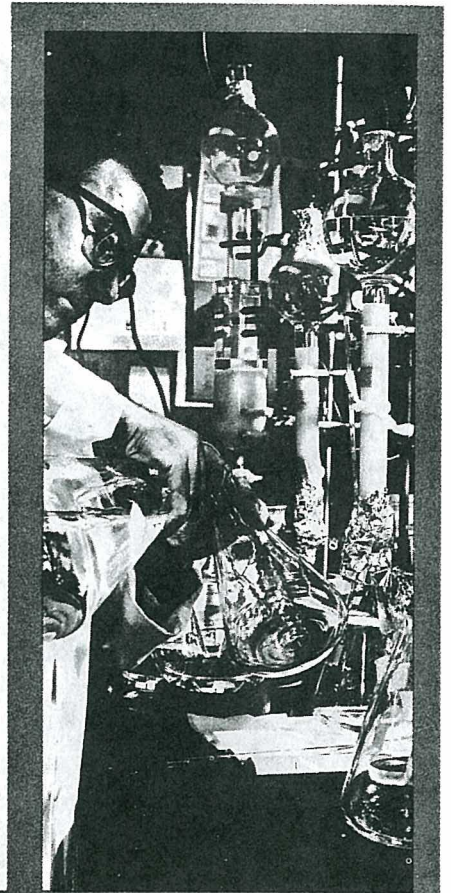

The City of Hope, founded in 1913, occupies 93 landscaped acres and is engaged in patient care, research and medical education in the catastrophic diseases. Its doors are open on a non-sectarian basis to sufferers from cancer and leukemia, chest, blood and heart ailments, diabetes, and certain maladies of heredity and metabolism. Basic studies are also conducted in these areas and in lupus, Huntington's disease, genetics and neurosciences. No patient has ever paid one penny for treatment, regardless of extent or expense.

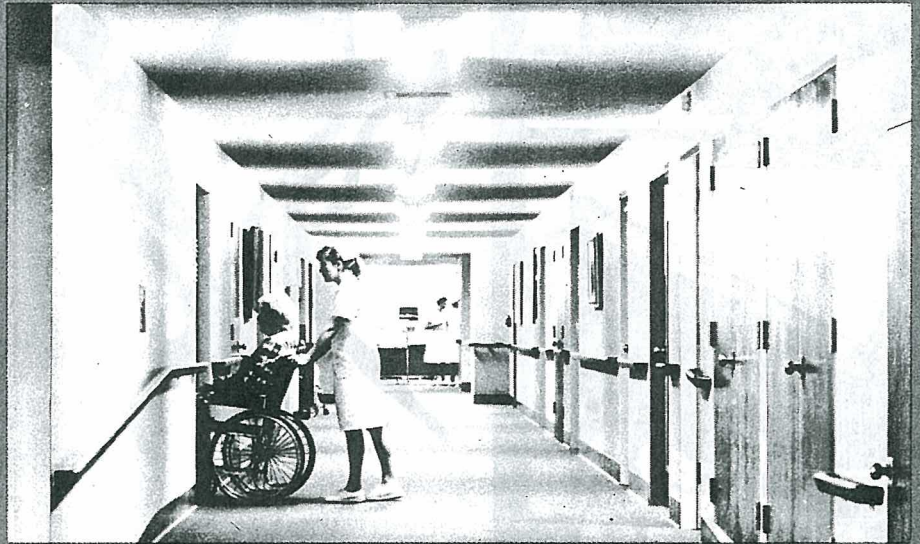

Tens of thousands of patients from cities in every part of America have been recipients of the Medical Center's personalized, quality inpatient, outpatient and consultation facilities.

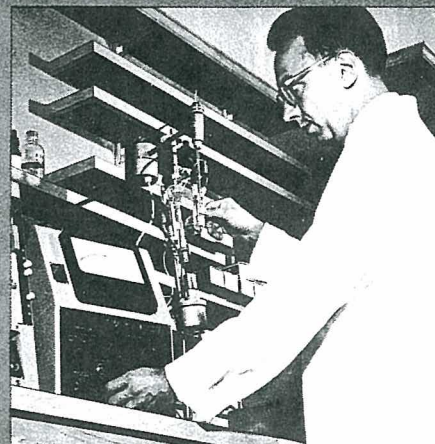
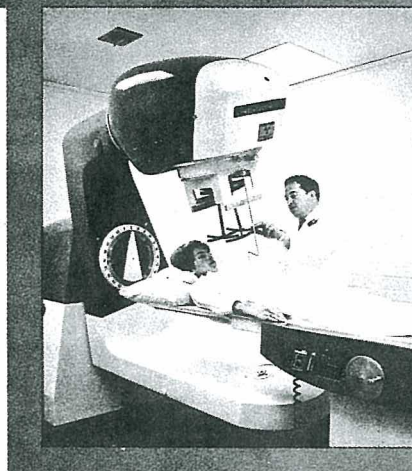
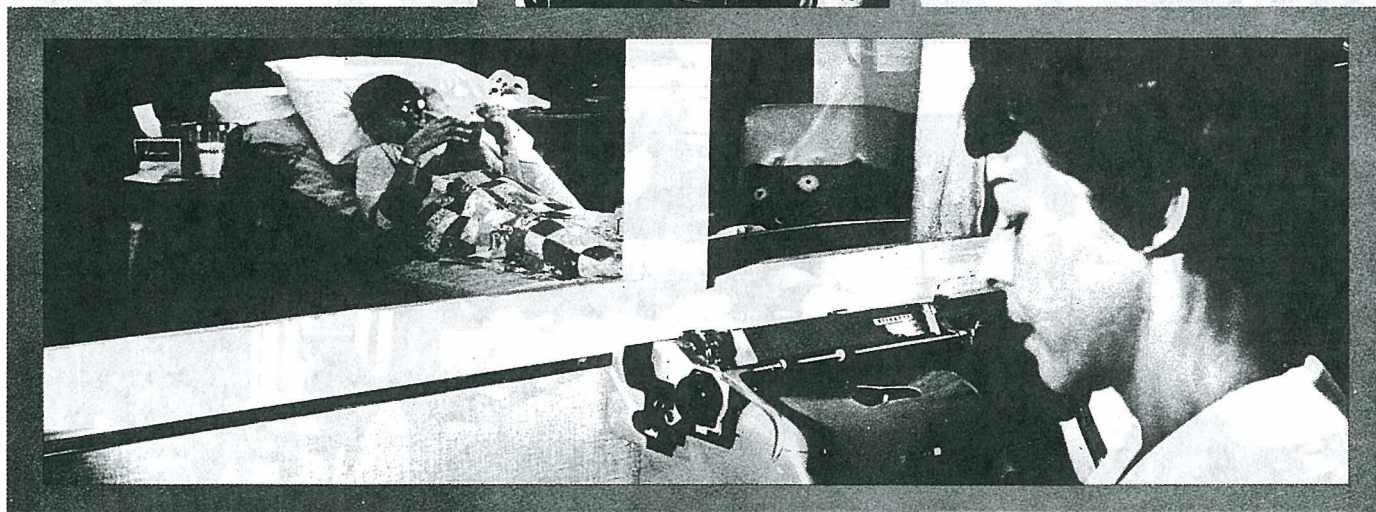
The unique character of the City of Hope lies primarily in its world renowned role as a Pilot Medical Center seeking to influence medicine and science everywhere. In recent years, hundreds of original discoveries and findings have emerged from its laboratories and staff — seeking to relieve pain, prolong life, and effect cures. It can truly be characterized as a "hospital's hospital," affecting millions of victims of crippling and killer diseases throughout the land.



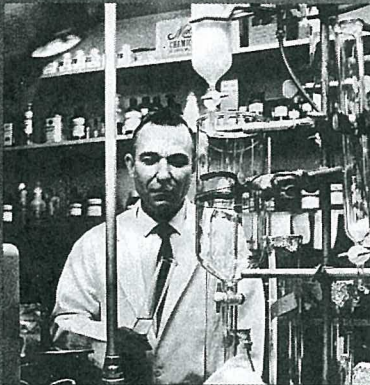
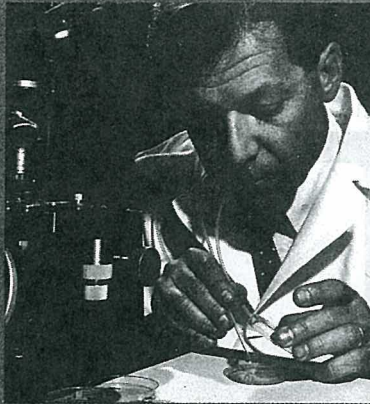
Recognition has been given to its outstanding clinical and basic research. Grants of about two million dollars a year come from the National Institutes of Health, the National Science Foundation and other agencies to the more than 100 research projects presently under way at the City of Hope. U.S. government agencies have sponsored and subsidized international scientific conferences at the City of Hope. Every year, at the request and expense of our own or a foreign government, City of Hope scientists attend conferences to present their findings.



In patient care, the City of Hope has pioneered in psychosomatic approaches, the totality of patient care, and family-centered medicine. In medical instrumentation, it has piloted a lower-cost cobalt "bomb," cesium "ring," cancer radiation therapy under super-atmospheric conditions, the sphygmometer and vectorcardiograph in heart diagnosis, and many more. In techniques, it has developed new diagnostic, surgical and therapeutic approaches.

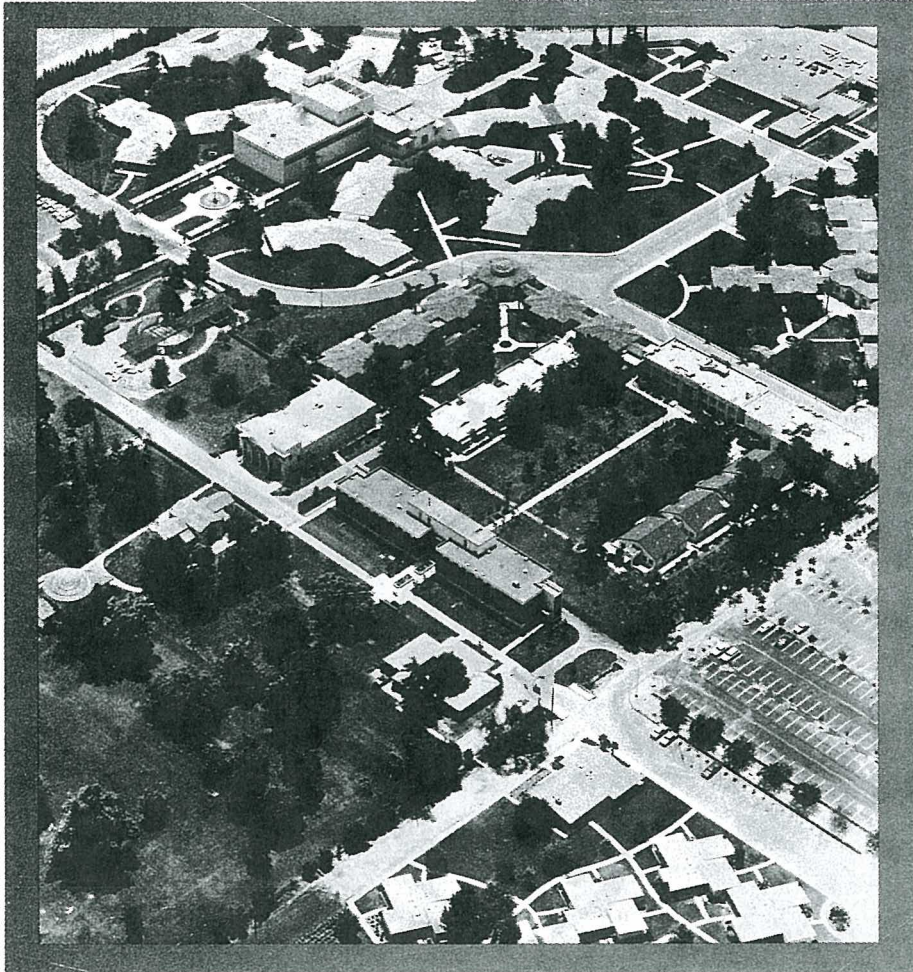
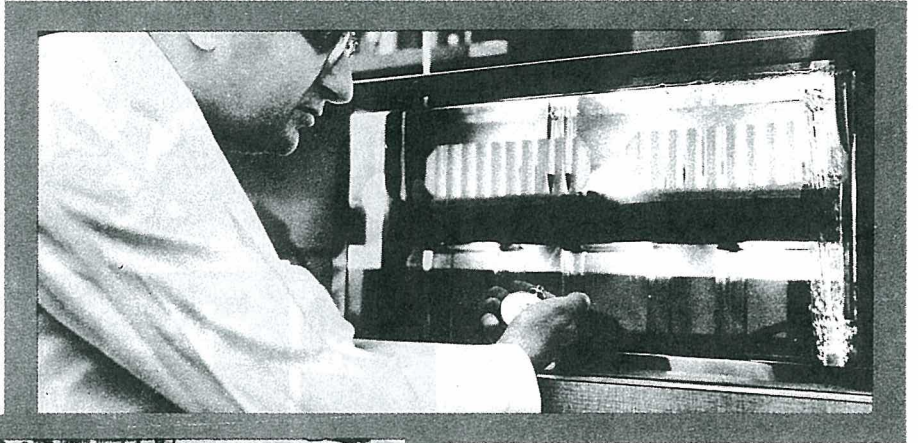


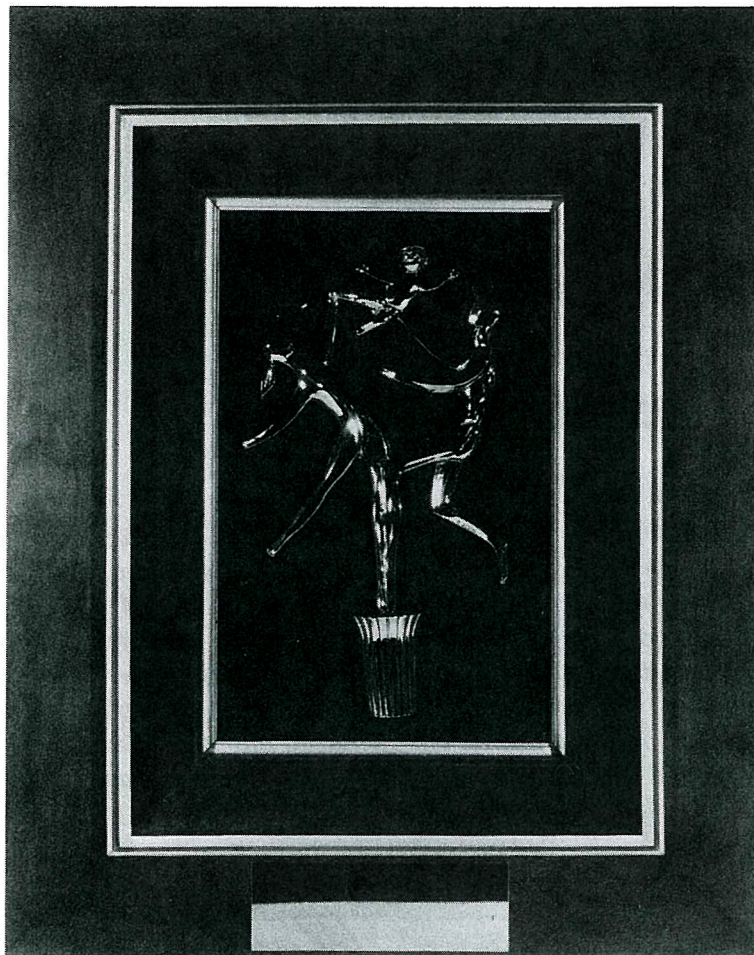
In medical education, the City of Hope conducts national conferences in various specialties. It trains skilled physicians and professionals for work in other national and international agencies. Its Institute for Biomedical Studies makes possible the gathering of some of the world's best brains, including Nobel Prizewinners, to facilitate a "crash program" against disease.



In its most ambitious program to date, the City of Hope has launched a "New Horizons for a Pilot Medical Center Program" to reach out for new facilities, new equipment, new programs and new staff. The cost for this ten-year expansion is 28.5 million dollars, above and beyond its annual operating budget.

The City of Hope is in a category all its own. It is not in "competition" with any other institution in any city, state or nation. The impact of its program is universal, qualitative, and original . . . a boon to all mankind.

Richard E. McCaman, Ph.D., Head of the Cellular Microchemistry Section in the Neurosciences Division, City of Hope, was born in Barberton, Ohio, in 1930. He received his B.A. degree from Wabash College, Crawfordsville, Indiana, in 1952, and his Ph.D. in pharmacology from Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, in 1957.

Before joining the staff of the City of Hope in 1968, Dr. McCaman was associated with Indiana University Medical School and Center at Bloomington as Assistant Professor of Biochemistry, Associate Professor and Principal Investigator in Neurochemistry.

The author of many research reports in scientific journals, he is a member of the American Society of Biological Chemists, the Association for Research in Nervous and Mental Diseases, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and other professional groups.

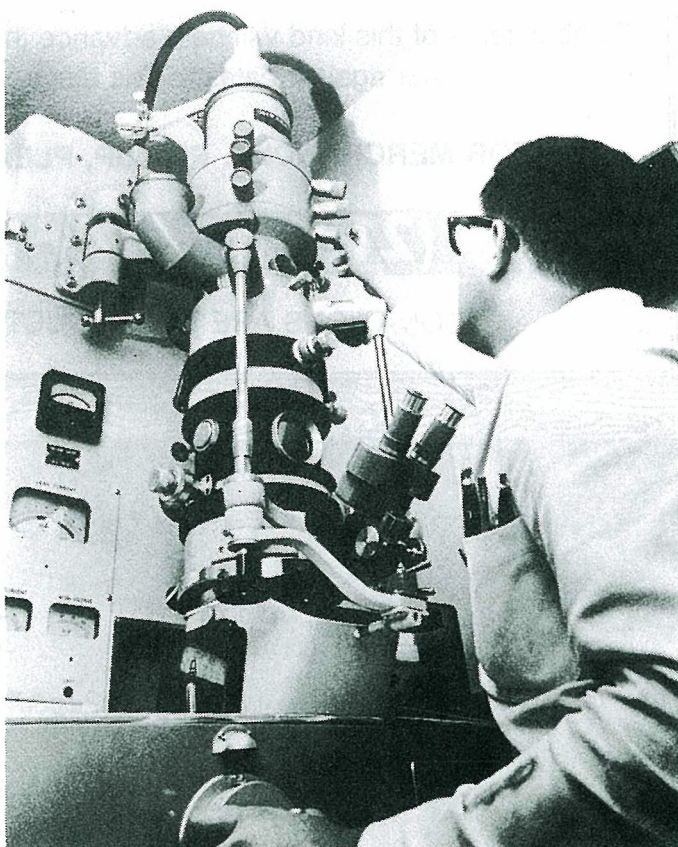
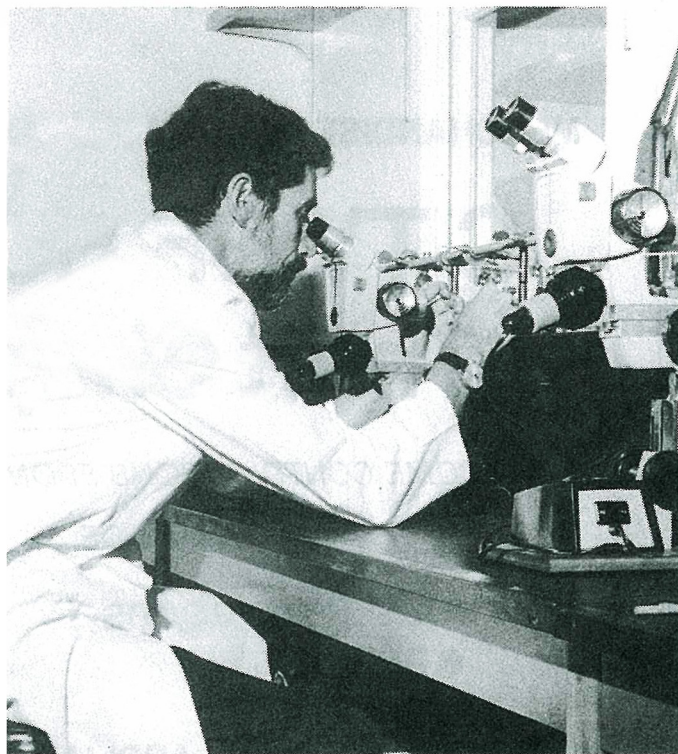
A process of enormous importance in both health and disease is that which regulates the transmission of impulses in the brain and central nervous system. The San Diego Research Fellow has made significant contributions to this field, focusing his investigations on the role of acetylcholine and related compounds believed to be major excitatory substances.

This Fellowship was established in 1972 in honor of Angelo Adams, San Diego-City of Hope Man of the Year, and in 1973-74 honored Kim Fletcher.

For 1975-76, the San Diego Research Fellowship will be in honor of Walter J. Zable.

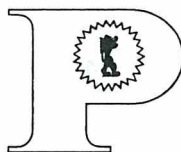
